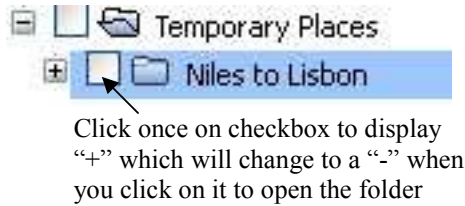


Managing network links, folders and features in Google Earth



When you open a Google Earth kml/kmz link from railsandtrails.com, it will open in Temporary Places layer Google Earth. You must click once on the checkbox for the link to get the “+” symbol indicating that there are network linked files and folder available for choosing. When you click on the “+”, the folder will open displaying its contents. When you click to check an individual feature *checkbox* it will display on the map. If you double-click on the feature *name*, Google Earth will center that feature on the screen. When a feature *name* is highlighted, you can use the opacity slider to fade that feature. Some features may take some time to load the first time, be patient.
